HIGH-END art Tair Art Basel has been hacked, and the wealthy individuals and art dealers who attend the events have been warned their personal information may have been stolen.

Art Basel's parent company, MCH Group—which operates the fancy art fair in Basel, Switzerland, as well as Miami Beach and Hong Kong, plus the watch and jewelry show Baselworld—bas sent out a mailing to warn its list of highhas sent out a mailing to warn its list of high-end attendees that MCH "was hit by a criminal cyberattack using malware" and their personal details may have been stolen. The group has now filed a criminal complaint, but admits it does not yet know who the hackers are. A message to Art Basel clients sent on Fri-day reads, "The information currently availa-

ble to us suggests that the perpetrators may have gained access to data such as personal contact details. We do not yet know the extent of the data breach and these traces are being analyzed in cooperation with cybersecurity

experts as a matter of urgency."

The message continues: "As always, we recommend that you exercise caution when dealing with unknown contacts, for instance if you ing with unknown contacts, for instance if you are contacted by third parties by e-mail or telephone, who may represent themselves as your bank, internet provider or insurance company and use personal details to gain your trust. The MCH Group has filed a criminal complaint against the perpetrators unknown to us and is cooperating closely with the relevant authori-

MCH has been working closely with security and cybercrime specialists, including the Swiss National Cyber Security Centre, the police and external experts," says the e-mail. ICE Cube has quit a \$9 million role in the Jack Black comedy "Oh Hell No" after refusing to get vaccinated. The Hollywood Reporter first revealed that Cube porter first revealed that Cube exited the Sony comedy, which is also produced by Black, on Friday. The production was preparing to start shooting in Hawaii with director **Kitao Sakurai**, the filmmaker behind Netflix's breakout comedy "Bad Trip." The outlet added: "Producers on 'Oh Hell No' made the request that cast on No made the request that cast on the project would need to be vac-cinated." The film had already pushed back its start date after Black injured himself in June while filming a gag for the last episode of **Conan O'Brien**'s talk episode of Conan O'Brien's talk show. Sources told THR the studio was looking to find a replacement for Cube, who throughout the pandemic has promoted mask-wearing. In August, Bacone College in Oklahoma thanked the star and others for a donation of 2,000 masks. In April 2020, amid COVID-19 lockdowns, he unveiled T-shirts inspired by his 1992 classic "Check Yo Self," featuring the title lyric and a pic of himself in a surgical mask, with proceeds going to health care workers. "I've had to cancel several commitments and I'm sorry I won't be able to make those happen." Kardashian noted that she is "luckily" vaccinated. "All will be OK," she wrote. "We will be over here in quarantine and following current guidelines." Kardashian was a pioneer in contracting — and getting access to a test for — the disease, getting it in March 2020. She documented her experience in self-recorded videos from her bedroom that aired during the final season of her familial reality show. "I suffer from migraines, but this was the craziest headache

... The coughing, my chest would burn when I would cough," she recalled recently. "Let me tell you, that s--t is real," she warned. Kardashian family members including **Kim**, her now-estranged husband (the rapper formerly known as **Kanye West**) and their kids also caught the virus at various points in the pandemic.
